5. <u>COMMUNICATIONS FROM PERSONS PRESENT</u>

Speaking to Council were: Ross Schriftman, regarding neighbors assisting with resources and services; Annie Dundas, 9-8-8 stickers for City vehicles; Copper, regarding the importance of skate

parks; Sailor Martinez, regarding the mental health benefits of skating; Espinosa, regarding the positive impacts that skating has had on his life; Pat Sweeney, regarding repairs at the skate park; Brian, regarding a street closure and issues related to homelessness; and Dennis Steinsland, regarding the audio system for the Council meetings. Council directed City Manager Napier to look into the issue of who is responsible for dealing with racoons and skunks that create issues for citizens.

6.A.1. ESTABLISH DATE OF PUBLIC HEARINGS

Moved by Councilor Cathey, seconded by Vice Mayor Pacheco, to, by minute action, establish September 5, 2023, as the public hearing date for:

- a. An ordinance amending Chapter 5.08 of the Casper Municipal Code Sections 5.08.150 and 5.08.390 changing business revenue requirements for bar and grill licenses; and,
- b. An ordinance amending Chapter 6.04 of the Casper Municipal Code facilitating Metro Animal Services in establishing and operating a trial trap, neuter, and return program.

Councilor Pollock abstained from voting on Item 6.A.1.a. Motion passed.

7. PUBLIC HEARING – MINUTE ACTION

Mayor Knell opened the public hearing for the consideration of the transfer of ownership of Retail Liquor License No. 12.

City Attorney Nelson entered four (4) exhibits: correspondence from Fleur Tremel to J. Carter Napier, dated July 28, 2023; Casper Star-Tribune Proof of Publication, published on August 3rd and 8th, 2023; an affidavit of website publication, dated August 2, 2023; and a liquor license application filed July 18, 2023. Acting City Manager Belser gave a brief report.

Speaking in favor of the transfer was: John Johnson. There were no citizens to speak against the item. The public hearing was closed.

Moved by Councilor Cathey, seconded by Councilor Jensen to, by consent minute action authorize the transfer of ownership of Retail Liquor License No. 12 from Mesa Liquors, LLC, dba Mesa Liquor, located at 3243 Talon Drive, Suite 200, to Casper Taco Shop, LLC, dba Fuzzy's Taco Shop, located at 3243 Talon Drive, Suite 200, 300, and 400. Councilor Pollock abstained from voting. Motion passed.

8.A.1. THIRD READING ORDINANCE

Following ordinance read:

ORDINANCE NO. 14-23

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CASPER MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 6.04.040 – KEEPING OF PETS, LIVESTOCK OR FOWL; LIMITATIONS; FEEDING OF NON-DOMESTICATED ANIMALS PROHIBITED.

Councilor Pollock presented the foregoing ordinance for approval and adoption on third reading. Seconded by Councilor Engebretsen.

Citizens to speak on the ordinance were: Cheryl Parlett, asking about bird feeders and squirrels; and Justin Binfet, of the Wyoming Game & Fish Department, discussing his support of the ordinance.

Councilor Engebretsen asked Mr. Binfet to discuss the trapping of skunking and raccoons, and he discussed options for citizens dealing with these animals. There were no amendments. Motion passed.

8.A.2. THIRD READING ORDINANCE

Following ordinance read:

ORDINANCE NO. 15-23

AN ORDINANCE IN SUPPORT OF CONTINUING THE FIFTH CENT OPTIONAL GENERAL PURPOSE EXCISE TAX PURSUANT TO WYOMING STATUTES SECTION 39-15-203(a)(i)(F)(II).

Councilor Engebretsen presented the foregoing ordinance for approval and adoption on third reading. Seconded by Councilor Pollock.

Citizens to speak in support of the ordinance were: Tyler Daugherty, Justin Farley, JoAnn True, Charlie Powell, Shane True, and Pat Sweeney.

Citizens to speak in opposition of the ordinance were: Ross Schriftman, Cheryl Parlett, Rosemary Sebahn, Zac Horton, Vernon Jones, Jeanette Ward, Sandra England, Trevor (no identified last name), Mary Schmidt, Eric Paulson, Jane Lock, and Tony Lock.

Councilors Engebretsen, Pollock, Bond, Gamroth, Cathey, Jensen and Vice Mayor Pacheco, and Mayor Knell all spoke in favor of the ordinance and all gave statements explaining how the 5th cent tax is essential to continue providing necessary services and maintain vital infrastructure in Casper. They also discussed that this is not a new tax, and has been in place for several decades; that they are representing the community as a whole when voting on the ordinance; and that passing this ordinance is the fiscally responsible decision. Vice Mayor Pacheco echoed Councilors Gamroth, Cathey, and Bond previous statements asking that Council codify the community survey for one cent so that that piece continues into the future.

There were no amendments. Motion passed.
